# August Virtual & Live Meeting **Brian Evans**

A former officer and instructor for Dallas Area Woodturners, I have demonstrated for a number of clubs in North and Central Texas. I have been lucky enough to take classes with Jean Francois Escoulen, Michael Hosaluk, Stuart Batty, Nick Cook, Betty Scarpino, Jimmy Clews and Windsor chair maker, Dave Sawyer.

I love to make gifts for people. Over the years I have made and given away nearly

two thousand bowls, boxes, tops, ornaments and other turnings. I also turn furniture and architectural pieces.

Trying to make duplicate pieces is stressful for most woodturners. My demo will show how to make multiples using a process for turning the basic shapes of woodturning, measuring properly, making and using a storyboard and dealing with vibration.



Osage Orange, Bois D'arc, or Horse Apple, no matter what you prefer to call it, this wood is definitely unique. The first thing you may notice is the bright yellow color which is really stunning and has some nice natural luster. When you go to pick it up, you might be shocked to find how heavy it is! It is very dense and on the Janka Hardness scale, is 2,620lb/f. It is typically straight grained and turns very well. It dulls saws and other instruments very quickly but the result is usually worth it! Be aware that it will change to a medium brown especially when exposed to sunlight.

Fun fact, it is a popular wood to use in making archery bows which is how it got one of its names. Bois D'arc translates to bow wood in French. It is also used to make musical instruments. It is very stable with little movement making it a perfect wood for those specialty items. If you aren't sure if the wood you have is Osage Orange, take some shavings and put it into some water. The wood contains a water soluble yellow dye.


